The Data to Policy (D2P) program, developed by Vital Strategies and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) as part of the Bloomberg Philanthropies Data for Health Initiative, aims to bridge the data-policy gap through team-based training and mentoring of health policy professionals. With PEPFAR's successes turning HIV into a chronic condition, many Africans are living full lives with HIV, but they are facing non-communicable diseases that come with lifelong antiretroviral therapy (ART), lifestyle changes accompanying the epidemiologic transition, and aging. Nutritional factors are central to many of these, especially in low-income countries, affecting pathogenic processes in the gastrointestinal tract, kidneys, nervous system, and cardiovascular system.
