COURSE OVERVIEW

Course Overview (75 - 100 words describing the course)

This rotation is designed to expose fellows to principles of addiction psychiatry and treatment. Intensive (8 hour) training on the pharmacology and use of buprenorphine occurs prior to the rotation. Fellows receive 2 weeks of training in recognition and treatment of opioid addiction/dependence, including initiation, management, and pharmacology of partial opioid agonists (buprenorphine). This rotation occurs on an inpatient consult service at Vanderbilt University Hospital (VUH). Fellows round with the psychiatry team, assessing patients and managing addiction therapy plans.
