Compensation:

Steps in licensing, immigration and hospital credentialing:

Our team manages the process of applying for a license with the Tennessee Board of Medicine. There are specific requirements from the Board, and we can discuss those requirements, and the process itself, on an individual basis.

VUMC has an in-house immigration office that manages the visa application process for international recruits. Our department also works closely with the VUMC credentialing office.

Dr. Aman Kalsi is an assistant professor of Pediatric Cardiac Anesthesiology at Vanderbilt University Medical Center. In 2006, Dr. Kalsi received his MBBS from Guy's Kings & St. Thomas School of Medicine in London, United Kingdom. 
