

Caring for You During Your Research Visit

The staff at the **Center for Cognitive Medicine** take safety very seriously. This is why we are taking extra steps to ensure that when you come for a research visit, all necessary precautions have been taken to reduce the risk of COVID-19 infection. We will do our part to prevent infection, but we also ask you to do your part.

What We Will Do



- Screen our staff for symptoms of COVID-19 prior to starting each shift.




- Wear masks and appropriate personal protective equipment as needed throughout your visit.



- Sanitize exam and testing rooms before and after each visit.
- Clean public areas frequently.



- Limit the number of research participants in our office.
- Take you to our own private waiting area, away from the general public.



- When possible, we will maintain a distance of 6 ft.



- Structure visits in a manner that will reduce the amount of time you are in our office.
- Conduct as much of the study visit as possible remotely via videoconference or phone.

What We Will Ask You to Do When You Visit



- Prior to coming for your visit, a staff member will call you to screen you for COVID-19 symptoms.
- The staff member will ask if you have been exposed to COVID-19 or have been tested for the virus.
- Upon your arrival, you will have your temperature taken at the entrance of the building.



- Please wear a face mask throughout the visit. If you don't have one, we will provide one to you.
- As needed, study staff will provide you with appropriate personal protective equipment that may include a gown and gloves.
