The inaugural group of Chaplain Residents graduated on September 3 after a year of dedication to the patients, families, and staff of VUMC. The residents, along with the support of Sr. Program Manager and ACPE Educator Rev. Young-ki Eun, Patient and Family Leadership, and Staff Chaplains, worked hard to build rapport with unit staff, increase visibility of chaplains on various floors, and expand the outreach of spiritual care throughout the hospital system. Through their efforts, they laid the groundwork for the CPE Program at VUMC and paved the way for future residents and interns to come.

Following graduation, all residents will continue their work in spiritual care for patients and families. Fr. Stephen Abaukaka will serve as a chaplain in a hospice care facility in Oregon, Chaplain Fred Brown will serve as a chaplain at Vanderbilt Children's Hospital, Chaplain Mary Murphy will continue as a contract chaplain at VUH, and Rev. Kelli X will serve part-time as a chaplain at Alive Hospice and work as a contract chaplain for VUH.

We celebrate all they have done and wish them well as they continue their spiritual care journeys.



New Chaplain Residents and Interns


It was with much anticipation and joy that we welcomed our first class of CPE Chaplain Interns and our second class of CPE Chaplain Residents. The 2021 Fall Extended Unit Chaplain Interns began their orientation process on August 16 and started their clinical rotations on the week of August 30. The Chaplain Interns attend classes on Mondays and serve part-time at their clinical site placements at Vanderbilt University Adult Hospital (VUAH), Vanderbilt Children's Hospital (VCH), or Vanderbilt Psychiatric Hospital (VPH) throughout the week under the supervision of Rev. Young-ki Eun and their assigned Staff Chaplain mentors. Already, the chaplain interns are bringing their unique gifts and much-needed spiritual care to the patients, family, and staff of VUMC. The duration of their internship and clinical service to the hospital will run through December 31, with their Exit Interview and Graduation scheduled for Monday, December 27, 2021.

The 2021-2022 Chaplain Residents began their orientation process on September 7 and started their coursework and clinical site placements the week of September 14. The residents attend half-day classes on Tuesdays and Thursdays each week and serve full-time at various areas of the hospital while completing their initial clinical assignments at either VUAH, VCH, or VPH. In a few short weeks, the residents have already immersed themselves in their coursework and spent many hours providing spiritual care to patients, families, and staff. Their residency will run for one year and cover three units of CPE:

- First Unit: September 7, 2021 January 7, 2022 (Integrative Period: Dec. 13 - Jan. 7)
- Second Unit: January 10, 2022 May 6, 2022 (Integrative Period: Apr. 11 - May 6)
- Third Unit: May 9, 2022 September 2, 2022 (Integrative Period: Aug. 8 - Sept. 2)

Exit Interviews and Graduation for the residents are slated for Friday, September 2, 2022.




