New CPE program at VUMC

Vanderbilt University Medical Center has established a new Clinical Pastoral Education Program to provide clinical training to chaplain residents while also providing spiritual support to VUMC patients, families, and staff.

In late July, the Medical Center received pre-provisional accreditation for the one-year chaplain residency program from the Association of Clinical Pastoral Education (ACPE). The program also welcomed Rev. Young-ki Eun as Sr. Program Manager and ACPE Educator. In August, the CPE Professional Advisory Group (PAG) held its inaugural meeting. Then, in September, the program began with four new chaplain residents - Fr. Stephen Abaukaka, Fred Brown, Mary Murphy, and Rev. Kelli X attending classes and serving in various areas around the hospital complex. Also, in September, the PAG appointed The Rev. Peter Keese as its chairperson, and the CPE program added Suzanne DeVos as parttime Administrative Assistant.

In October, the CPE Program added Imam Ossama Bahloul, Ph.D. and Rabbi Laurie Rice as new members of the PAG.

In November, the program achieved Provisional Accreditation status through ACPE.

The CPE Team continues to grow the department through establishing its shared office space and expanding its outreach to patients, staff, and community partners.

Over the past 20 years, VUMC participated in partnership with several area hospitals and Alive Hospice to train chaplain residents at its member sites, but the increasing size of the Medical Center's hospital network and its growing number of critically ill patients led us to the decision to create a VUMC-based CPE program for chaplain residents.

In doing research, we discovered we were one of the few academic medical centers in the country without our own chaplain residency program. Our tremendous growth indicated that the time had come to develop a program with a curriculum tailored to our patient population and staff.

Our Professional Advisory Group (PAG) has already begun to actively contribute to our early success by advising us on our, now approved, provisional accreditation document. Many thanks to Peter Keese for agreeing to serve as our first PAG chair and to our founding PAG members.

Clearly, VUMC benefits by having these Chaplain Residents/Interns available not only to extend our full-time chaplaincy service at VUMC, but also to embrace the mission of improving the health/spiritual care of "individuals and communities regionally - through the exceptional capabilities and caring spirit of its people." Rev. Young-ki Eun M.A., M.Div., ACPE started his CPE journey in 1999 at Toronto General Hospital, Canada. He completed his CPE Residency at New York Presbyterian - Cornell Medical Center, and his CPE Supervisory Training at the Health Care Chaplaincy, New York. He was certified by ACPE as an Associate Supervisor in 2009 and as a full-Supervisor in 2013. His work as a CPE supervisor includes New York Presbyterian-Columbia University Medical Center, The Hospital of St. Raphael (now, Yale New Haven Hospital-St Raphael Campus), Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center, Boston, New York Theological Seminary and Ochsner Health System, New Orleans.







Announcements and Updates New CPE Extended Unit Offerings – beginning Fall 2021

The CPE Fall Extended Unit (mid-August thru end-of-December) and Spring Extended Unit (mid-January thru early-June) are part-time and are geared for those with ongoing professional or educational commitments. This part-time CPE meets one day per week for class for 20 weeks. Normally, the class will meet on Mondays (8:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m.) except for the first two weeks where students should be prepared to spend two or three days each week in orientation. Also, students will engage in sixteen (16) hours per week in clinical ministry at their assigned clinical site. Students may choose from two options for clinical assignments: One day shift (8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.) and one night shift (1:30 pm - 10:00 pm) or two night shifts (1:30 p.m. - 10:00 p.m.) weekdays or weekends - providing spiritual care to patients, families and staff, and participate in some on-call duty at Vanderbilt University Medical Center.
