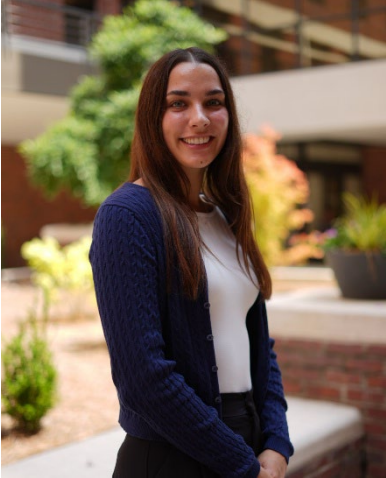


CURRENT RESIDENT
