Welcome... from the CEO & Dean!

As an alumnus of our medical and graduate schools, I've been a member of the Vanderbilt family since the age of 22. After some time away for training in the 1980's, and a series of roles in our clinical, educational, and research programs, I've had the privilege of serving as the chief executive of VUMC and as dean of the Vanderbilt Medical School since 2009. Throughout the past few decades, VUMC has been on a journey, moving from a well-established regional academic medical center to a more widely recognized, national destination for healthcare, science, and training. Today, as the fifth largest recipient of research funds from the National Institutes of Health (NIH), our center is among the most highly regarded in the nation, with our departments of Medicine, Otolaryngology and Pediatrics No. 1 in the nation in NIH research grant support. Many of our training programs also enjoy national leadership, with both Urology and Otolaryngology ranked No. 1 in the nation, as well as our Bill Wilkerson hearing and speech graduate programs.

It is noteworthy that a wide array of clinical programs at VUMC have become national destinations for specialized care. Our heart transplant program is now the largest in the nation, and our solid organ transplant programs overall are the third largest in the nation. Many other clinical programs are seen as nation leading, from cochlear implantation to pediatric infectious disease. The Mid-South's largest NCI-designated comprehensive cancer center, The Vanderbilt-Ingram Cancer Center, is a national leader in personalized cancer medicine. These accomplishments speak not only to a major focus on building clinical program scale that allows us to reach patients far beyond our region, but also to the research and training programs that power them, providing the most cutting-edge and innovative care platforms and a constant supply of the most highly specialized and talented clinicians.

VUMC's industry leadership in biomedical informatics, with the nation's largest academic department of more than 130 faculty coupled to expansive investments in health information technology, creates a platform for a multitude of clinical innovations. These include the rapid integration of basic and clinical research informing cutting-edge bedside care, as well as decision-supported virtual care supporting clinicians working in hospitals across our region. By coupling these sophisticated informatics platforms with DNA collection, the medical center has become a national leader in precision medicine. After nearly two decades of development, BioVU is the nation's largest health system-based DNA repository linked to deidentified electronic health records with over 350,000 patient samples. The NIH Data and Research Support Center for the US Precision Medicine "All of Us" Program is based at VUMC, and our NIH-supported Potocsnak Undiagnosed Disease Center (UDN) leverages BioVU to provide a diagnosis rate of well over 50%, nearly double the overall NIH UDN network rate.

Unlike many peer academic medical centers, VUMC is a financially and legally independent, not-for-profit academic medical center with its own Board of Directors. We maintain a strong, historic academic affiliation with Vanderbilt University that provides for our medical school educational programs and a vast array of collaborative research activities with VUMC investigators. Having experienced remarkable growth during the past decade, VUMC is the working and learning home to more than 45,000 people and is the largest private employer in Nashville and Middle Tennessee. We house the largest clinical practice plan in the Mid-South, with over 5,000 physicians and nurse practitioners delivering care in our seven campus and regional hospitals, and nearly 200 clinic locations across five states. With residency and fellowship programs training physicians in more than 185 clinical specialties, we are the largest physician training program in the Mid-South. Our nursing residency program is also a source of distinction and is one of the largest such programs in the nation, providing further clinical experience in specialized care across a broad range of specialties.

I am honored to welcome you to this very special place. It is my hope that this orientation session not only provides you with tools to be successful but also introduces you to our very distinctive caring and collaborative culture. Today you will hear from key leaders who will share our resources and programs, while also emphasizing the priority we place on being engaged with fellow co-workers. You will also have an opportunity to fulfill several of your compliance training requirements, of great importance to keeping our atmosphere safe and rewarding.

We will only be as successful as the people here, and it is my highest priority to support and encourage you throughout your VUMC career. As one of the nation's leading medical centers with extraordinary resources and capabilities, I am mindful of our responsibility not only to the people of this region, but to the nation and the world. Thank you for joining us, and I look forward to meeting you and working with you in the days ahead.
