DUAL DEGREE GRADUATES

Students who graduate from this dual degree program will be competitive for positions in governmental agencies (e.g., ministries of health), bilateral and multilateral institutions (e.g., World Bank, CDC, PAHO), international development agencies, non-governmental organizations, private foundations (e.g. Gates Foundation), private consultancies, and academia.

ADMISSION INFORMATION & DEADLINES

Admission is a two-step process: Applicants must apply for and be accepted into both masters programs. Applicants should state in their applications they have applied to the other program.

THE PROGRAM

The Vanderbilt M.A./M.P.H. dual degree

program seeks to equip students for diverse positions in global public health and Latin American studies, including those in policy and management, advocacy, and program development, implementation, and monitoring & evaluation. Through an innovative, interdisciplinary curriculum grounded in didactic and experiential learning, this dual degree offers an opportunity for students to more fully understand and apply alternative solutions to current and emerging health challenges in Latin America and among Latina/o populations in the United States.

While both programs have specific requirements that the student must meet in order to graduate, students can tailor their curriculum and experience to their own individualized pursuits and complement their core coursework with classes in business, law, religion, regional and area studies, and other disciplines across Vanderbilt University. Combined with a summer practicum experience, students will be prepared with essential skills and specialized content knowledge necessary to tackle some of the greatest health challenges of our time.

Culminating project(s) in which students synthesize theories and methodologies from both disciplines. May be two distinct, but linked, theses or one larger project that satisfies both the MA and MPH thesis requirements
