## Pregnancy, Insurance: Barriers to Accessing Opioid Treatment



Opioid agonist therapy (OAT)

is evidence-based treatment for opioid use disorder, often using
 medications like buprenorphine or methadone. OAT decreases the risk of overdose death and improves pregnancy outcomes

Surveying OAT providers in 4 Appalachian states in 2017 revealed
