Health Equity Innovation Awards Question:

How can VUMC close the gaps for individuals who face social, cultural, geographic, and economic barriers to having the best health possible?

Background and Purpose

VUMC's Office of Health Equity (OHE) is pleased to announce *Health Equity Innovation Awards* focused on advancing health equity. Advancing health equity ensures that all people--including VUMC employees, patients, and community members--have the opportunity to attain their highest level of health, regardless of the social, cultural, and/or economic conditions in which they live, work, and play. These conditions are often referred to as the social determinants of health including employment, education, financial stability, transportation, housing, English proficiency, systemic racism, and exposure to violence, among others.¹ Examples of communities that systematically experience worse health outcomes related to these factors include racial/ethnic minorities, individuals with limited socioeconomic status, sexual and gender minorities, underserved rural residents, and others who experience discrimination or social disadvantage.

The *Health Equity Innovation Awards* support innovative ideas and solutions to advance health equity, ultimately improving health outcomes for impacted communities. The awards are built upon the principle that there are assets, opportunities, and innovative ideas within VUMC and in our communities that can advance health equity. Health equity innovations at any stage of development are welcome including early concepts and ideas that would benefit from feedback from health equity experts. Areas of interest and inspiration include but are not limited to:

- 1) How can VUMC help patients, employees, and/or community members find and navigate the organizations, programs, and resources they need to lead healthy lives?
- 2) How can VUMC enhance internal and external partnerships to better organize and deliver care to patients, employees, and/or community members?
- 3) What education or training would help VUMC conduct research and do quality improvement using a health equity lens?
- 4) How can data and technology advance health equity for patients, employees, and/or community members?
- 5) How can VUMC better understand the social and economic conditions that impact the quality of life and health outcomes for patients, employees, and/or community members?
- 6) How can VUMC increase the likelihood that all patients, employees, and/or community members have the best chance to be healthy?

Awards Guidelines

1. **Applicants and Teams:** Awards are open to Vanderbilt faculty, staff, residents, fellows, and post-docs. VU students* in medicine, nursing, public health, and other disciplines may apply but awards must be directly relevant to VUMC. Submissions by teams from different departments and areas within VUMC are encouraged.
**Please note: VU students may be the project leads. However, students will need a faculty sponsor who will be responsible for the conduct of the project.*
2. **Health Equity Focus:** Proposed ideas and solutions for this award must have a strong tie to improving health outcomes in impacted communities. The focus should be on health equity, which is different from Diversity & Inclusion. See [this](#) article to learn more about the differences between Health Equity and Diversity and Inclusion.
3. **Systems Thinking:** We encourage awards that address change at the policy and/or systems level. Please see the [OHE website](#) for more information.
4. **Support and Timeline:** The OHE will provide support up to \$10,000. Project support will come directly from the OHE cost center for effort/personnel and/or non-personnel expenses. Our OHE team will be engaged in a consultative capacity as needed. The implementation period for award ideas can vary but awards must be completed within twelve months.
