Therapeutic Duplication

What is Therapeutic Duplication?

- Therapeutic Duplication is when a provider orders more than one medication for the same indication.
 - A patient should **NEVER** have multiple meds for the exact same reason.
 - It is **not** within a nurse's scope of practice to decide what medication is appropriate to administer.

Pain Management Duplication Example:

- Oxycodone 10mg po q4h prn severe pain (pain score 8-10) AND
- Hydromorphone 0.5mg q4h prn severe pain (pain score (8-10)

Resolution

 Hydromorphone 0.5mg q4h prn severe pain (pain score (8-10) if pain is not relieved by po medication

Nausea Management Duplication Example:

- Promethazine 25mg IV q6h prn nausea
- Ondansetron 4mg po q6hr prn nausea

Resolution

Promethazine 25mg IV q6h prn nausea **if unable to take po**
