Arab American Heritage Month, Sexual Assault Awareness Month, Autism Acceptance Month, Celebrate Diversity Month, Earth Month, National Child Abuse Prevention Month, National Volunteer Month, Month of the Military Child, Military Saves Month

April 2, World Autism Awareness Day: This day is observed to raise awareness about people on the Autism spectrum. April 2, Palm Sunday (Christian): Palm Sunday is a celebration honoring Jesus Christ's victorious entry into Jerusalem on the Diversity and Inclusion Calendar 2023.

April 6, National Tartan Day (Scottish): This day commemorates the Scottish Declaration of Independence. April 7, Good Friday (Christian): This day commemorates the crucifixion of Jesus on the Friday before Easter.

April 5-13, Passover/Pesach (Jewish): Passover is celebrated by Jews every year, commemorating the anniversary of their miraculous Exodus from Egyptian slavery, as told in the Bible.

April 7, World Health Day: Spearheaded by the World Health Organization (WHO), physical, mental, and emotional well-being is promoted and celebrated all over the world on this day.

April 9, Easter (Christian): This festival and holiday celebrate the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, as described in the Old Testament. As always, the 2023 Easter will be celebrated on a Sunday.

April 14. National Day of Silence (LGBTQIAA+): People take a yow of silence to protest the harmful effects of harassment and discrimination against LGBTQ people in schools.

April 14, Vaisakhi (Sikh): For Hindus, Vaisakhi marks an ancient harvest festival and the solar new year. It also marks when Sikhism was born as a collective faith in 1699, when the Khalsa was founded.

April 17, Yom Hashoah (Jewish): Yom Hashoah also called Holocaust Remembrance Day commemorates the lives of the Jewish people who died in the Holocaust of World War 2.

April 21, Eid al-Fitr (Muslim): This day marks the end of Ramadan.

April 22, Earth Day: This is an international event celebrated worldwide to pledge support for environmental protection. April 26, Lesbian Visibility Day: This day is meant to celebrate, recognize, and bring visibility to lesbian-identifying members of the LGBTQ+ community. It's also about elevating and honoring this unique community that is historically overlooked and dismissed because members are both women and queer.
