Practice Question Evidence Translation

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The Johns Hopkins EBP process is divided into 3 phases and 18 steps.

PET - Practice Question, Evidence, Translation



Phase I - Asking Practice Questions

Step 1: Recruit inter-professional team

Step 2: Develop and refine the EBP question

Step 3: Define the scope of the EBP question and identify stakeholders

Step 4: Determine responsibility for project leadership

Step 5: Schedule team meetings



Phase II - Reviewing the Evidence

Step 6: Conduct internal and external search for evidence

Step 7: Appraise the level and quality of each piece of evidence

Step 8: Summarize the individual evidence

Step 9: Synthesize overall strength and quality of evidence

Step 10: Develop recommendations for change based on evidence synthesis

- Strong, compelling evidence, consistent results
- · Good evidence, consistent results
- · Good evidence, conflicting results
- Insufficient or absent evidence



Phase III - Translation

Step 11: Determine fit, feasibility, and appropriateness of recommendation(s) for translation path

Step 12: Create action plan

Step 13: Secure support and resources to implement action plan

Step 14: Implement action plan

Step 15: Evaluate outcomes

Step 16: Report outcomes to stakeholders

Step 17: Identify next steps

Step 18: Disseminate findings
