Vanderbilt University Medical Center Urology Advanced Practice Fellowship Program

Description:

12-month postgraduate program focused on adult urology. The first 8 months the APP will be exposed to all areas of urology including outpatient clinics and procedures, inpatient services, and the operating room. The last 4 months of the fellowship the APP fellow will have their own independent clinic, with mentored oversight, and spend time in our procedure clinic to learn specific in office urologic procedure such as cystoscopy. Mentorship and training are provided by both urologists and other advanced practice providers.

The APP fellow will be exposed to general urology and the subspecialties within urology including endourology, voiding dysfunction, pelvic floor reconstruction, men's health, urologic oncology, and neuro-urology. Didactic components include required readings, weekly rounds, resident conference, tumor board, and attendance of a local and national conference.

Upon graduation the fellow will receive a certificate from the ANCC AFFPA documenting successful completion of a postgraduate fellowship in urology at Vanderbilt University Medical Center.

Ideal candidate:

- Master's or Doctorate degree in nursing or physician assistant studies
- National Board Certification as a Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP), Adult Gerontology Primary Care Nurse Practitioner (AGPCNP), Adult Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner (AGACNP), or Physician Assistant (PA)
- TN License/Certificate of Fitness to Prescribe, eligible for NPI and DEA
- Interest in Urology.
