Description

18-month postgraduate program focused on Emergency Medicine in a community environment. APP will receive specialized didactic, procedural, and clinical training in the ED and off-service rotations. APP will rotate through the ED at 3 regional sites: Vanderbilt Wilson County Hospital, Vanderbilt Tullahoma-Harton Hospital, and Vanderbilt Bedford County Hospital. Mentorship will be from experienced and qualified physicians and APPs.

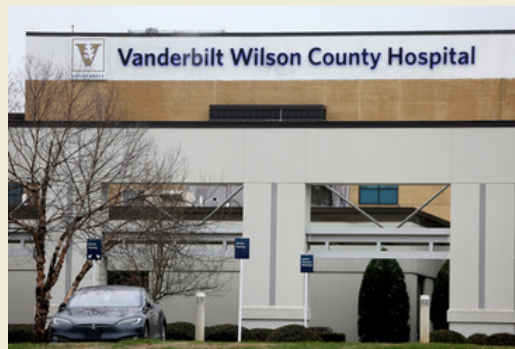
Didactics
