Evidence-based Practice and Nursing Research Committee Charter

Purpose

- The primary purpose of the Evidence-based Practice and Nursing Research Committee (NRC) is to improve patient outcomes through improved patient care driven by evidence-based practice.
- The secondary purpose is to facilitate research activities that generate nursing knowledge.

Definition of Evidence-based Nursing Practice

 Evidence-based practice (EBP) is a problem-solving approach to the delivery of health care that integrates the best evidence from studies and patient care data with clinician expertise and patient preferences and values. When delivered in a context of caring and in a supportive organizational culture, the highest quality of care and best patient outcomes can be achieved. (Melnyk; Fineout-Overholt; Stillwell; Williamson 2010)

Agenda Setting Process:

- All NRC members will provide input for the agenda planning, and the co-chairs will create the agenda
- Agenda is distributed 2 weeks prior and again two days prior to each meeting
- Agenda requests will be submitted via email to the co-chairs

Desired Outcomes

- Enhance nurses' skills in using research to improve practice
- Improved patient care
- Support leadership decisions that result in improved outcomes

Decision Making Process

- Decisions will be made by consensus
- NRC members are expected to provide input

NRC Membership

 - 1 nurse in leadership position for each entity (VUH, VCH, VMG, VPH)

 - 2 Vanderbilt School of Nursing faculty members
 - Representative from the Nursing Education Council

 - Representative from the Nursing Administrative Board
 - Representative from the Vanderbilt Human Research Protection Program
 - Representative from the Transition Management Department
 - Director, Nursing Research

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Roles and Responsibilities

- All members of the NRC
 - Identify and help to resolve barriers to evidence-based practice
 - Plan activities that enhance factors that facilitate evidence-based practice
 - Actively participate in scheduled committee meetings and related activities
 - Provide ongoing feedback about work progress
 - Consult with/coach staff across the clinical enterprise related to research and evidencebased practice
 - Committee members are asked to serve a minimum of two years
- Co-chairs
 - Lead committee to accomplish expected outcomes
 - Develop and plan agenda with input from the committee members
 - Facilitate committee meetings
 - Engage all key stakeholders to insure involvement and follow-up on action items and activities
 - Support and promote the work of the committee
 - Coordinate with administrative support to assure assignments are being completed
 - Co-chairs are elected annually by the members of the NRC and will serve three years Note: Serve one year in co-chair role, one year in chair role, and one year in past chair role
