These resources may be able to assist with financial assistance for rent, utilities, food, etc:

Programs include Room in the Inn (shelter), educational programs, respite care, alcohol and drug treatment case management, guest house (shelter for people undergoing alcohol and drug treatment), day services (assistance with meals, shower, clothing, case management, etc), Hispanic services.

 - Can apply for assistance with rent or utility bills.

 - Help with Food; offer emergency food box sites

 - Can help with low income material needs as well as baby supplies. Other programs include Refugee Services, Immigration Services, Hispanic Family Services, and Counseling Services.
- 8) **Women, Infant, and Children (WIC):** WIC clinics are located at the Health Departments (Lentz: 615-340-5619, Woodbine: 615-880-2299, South: 615-880-3210, East: 615-862-6626)
 - Program provides nutrition education and food vouchers to pregnant and breast feeding women, infants, and children up to six years of age.
- 9) **Department of Human Services (DHS):** Davidson County DHS (615-532-4000 or 615-743-2000)
 - Contact your local DHS office to apply or inquire about eligibility for food stamps, TennCare, and Families First (cash assistance program for single parent families).

Nashville Diaper Connection

We collect diapers and distribute them through our community partners. By being intermediaries, we limit duplication of services, reduce administration expenses and work collaboratively to solve a **basic human need** at the community level. If struggling families need diapers, they often have other needs as well, which are best addressed through our partner agencies and their full continuum of care.

Many of our partners have limited availability right now because of COVID-19. We recommend calling before visiting them.

Second Harvest Food Bank

Second Harvest has expanded their Emergency Food Box (EFB) sites. An EFB provides two to three days of staple food items based on the number of members in each household. During the pandemic, Davidson County residents can receive assistance as often as needed. Make sure to bring these with you:

- ID for all household members (driver's license, birth certificate, state-issued ID, etc.)
- Proof of address (piece of mail, bill, lease, etc.)

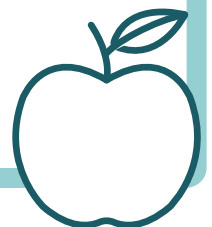

SNAP Food Stamps are help from the government to buy most foods in grocery stores. SNAP Food Stamps are not cash. SNAP Food Stamps are put on an electronic benefit transfer or EBT card each month. You use the EBT card like a debit card.
