# Occupational Health and the VUH Emergency Department present: Tip Sheet: VUMC Employee Bloodborne Pathogen Exposure: Evaluation and Follow-up

#### 1. Immediate Treatment

- Upon exposure, first wash exposed area with soap and water.
  - If blood/body fluids get in your eyes, flush the eyes with water for a minimum of 15 minutes. Remove contact lenses before flushing. Do not reinsert lenses until Occupational Health or the Emergency Department provider says it is okay to do.

#### 2. Confidential Medical Evaluation

- Following exposure, immediately seek medical evaluation
  - During normal business hours (Monday-Friday 7:00 am-5:30 pm): Contact the Vanderbilt Occupational Health Clinic (VOHC) by phone or proceed directly to the clinic at 640 Medical Arts Building.
  - Outside normal business hours: Proceed to the Vanderbilt Adult Emergency Department or Belcourt Walk-In clinic for immediate evaluation, or contact the Occupational Health provider on call (615-936-0955).
  - If exposed while in flight during a LifeFlight Fixed Wing Transport, call the VOHC provider on call (615-936-0955) for a treatment order and follow-up care.

## **3.** Obtain Source Labs: Obtain Source Labs and send to the lab within <u>**1 hour**</u> of staff exposure.

Work with the source patient's primary team to enter orders as follows:

- Inpatient, Community, Pre-Op/PACU: Enter the following EPIC order: "Source Blood/Body Fluid Exposure Panel-Order tests on the SOURCE from whom blood/body fluid originated."
  - Community and VUMC Pre-Op/PACU: Accept and Sign the order to make the order active immediately. Do not "Sign and Hold" orders.
- OpTime/Intra-Op: Collect 3 tubes of the source patient's blood (2 red + 1 lavender). Place an ADT patient label on each tube. Document the specimens in the Specimen Note and complete an "Intraoperative Source/Exposure Lab Request Form."
- Ambulatory: Enter the following SmartSet: "Source Blood/Body Fluid Exposure" and place a check by all labs.

- Report the exposure to VUMC Risk and Insurance Management via Veritas: VERITAS II (vumc.org)

## **Additional Information**

- Source Labs can be collected via a straight stick or obtained from a PIV or Central Line
- If you have challenges collecting Source Labs within 1 hour:
  - The source patient's unit Charge RN calls VOHC/ED/Belcourt Walk-In to provide updates and develop a Source Lab collection plan.
  - VUH Only: Use Mobile Heart Beat to identify staff members trained in Ultrasound Guided PIV placement:
    VUH Med US-Guided PIV RN, VUH Neuro US-Guided PIV RN, VUH RW US-Guided PIV RN, VUH Surg US-Guided PIV RN, VUH VHVI US-Guided PIV RN, VUH Women's US-Guided PIV RN
  - o Additional IVT/Phlebotomy resources may include Paramedics, NPs, CRNAs, or MDs as available.
