Frequently Asked Questions

- 1. I have been asked to host a visitor what steps are needed to facilitate this request?
 - Determine the role of the person wanting to observe, (student, physician, staff member, etc.)
 - Reach out to the appropriate contact (See table above)
 - Periop Education to be contacted by the department responsible for scheduling observation

2. Is there any training required prior to observing in the OR?

- Periop Education provides a Periop Basics class before observers are allowed in OR
- This is a 45-minute virtual, online, interactive, instructor-led class and is held every Friday morning at 7am (CST)
- It is an expectation that cameras will be on during the class
- The following content is reviewed during the Periop Basics class:
 - o Surgical attire
 - o Review the Periop Dress Code
 - o ID Badges
 - o PPEs
 - Review of surgical zones
 - o Standard precautions
 - Hand hygiene
 - o Overview of emergency safety systems
 - o Overview of the surgical suite and OR team member roles
 - o OR Etiquette
 - o Introducing yourself to the team and explaining your role
 - o Movement around the sterile field
 - \circ $\;$ Educating about how to move around the field as an un-scrubbed person
 - Maintaining proper boundaries Must be at least 12 inches away from the sterile field if unscrubbed
 - o Surgical conscience
- This class is not optional our patients' safety is our priority and anyone who enters the OR should have a baseline knowledge of the surgical environment as well as expectations
- Plan ahead Periop Education cannot accommodate last minute requests

3. Who must attend the Periop Basics class, how often is it held and how do I sign up?

- Anyone who observes, shadows, visits the Adult OR must attend a Periop Basics class provided by Perioperative Education *prior* to their observation
- Once your OR observation has been approved, you will be sent a link to register for the online training class which is held every Friday morning at 7:00am CST
- Class should be attended close to your observation day in the OR not months in advance
- To sign up for the class, scan the QR Code or click the survey link below and enter the code

- Once the class has been completed, the observer will be sent a post class survey
- Observers will not be permitted to observe unless the post class survey has been completed

4. Can I scrub into cases after taking the class?

- No this class does not train the visitor to scrub into cases
- Visitors who go through VOE are not permitted to scrub into cases
- VOE permits visitors to observe in the OR for a one time, 8-hour observational experience only No hands on allowed

5. I am a visiting medical student and have not gone through VOE - Can I scrub into cases?

- Visiting Medical Students are not permitted to scrub into cases unless the sponsoring surgeon requests them to do so, and notifies Perioperative Education in advance of their rotation <u>periopeducation@vumc.org</u>
- If a student, (visiting medical student) is being asked by a Surgeon to scrub into a case, proof of scrub training from the students' home institution must be provided to Perioperative Education or the student will not be permitted to scrub into cases
- If such proof cannot be provided, the student will not be permitted to scrub in unless they attend a Scrub Training class by Perioperative Education
- These scrub classes are scheduled well in advance
- Last minute classes **will not** be provided to accommodate lack of planning, preparation, and notification of the need for you to scrub in

6. How can I enroll in scrub training provided by Periop Education?

- Once it has been determined that scrubbing is a **necessary** part of your OR experience, Periop Education will send you a date for the next training class
- Last minute training classes will not be accommodated plan ahead

7. How do OR staff verify completion of Periop scrub training?

- You will be given a scrub sticker to place on the back of your ID badge as proof of your attendance and completion of the training (see image below)
- Our staff are trained to verify the visitor scrubbing in has had scrub training
- Without this sticker, you will not be allowed to scrub
- For visitors without a sticker, OR staff contacts Periop Education for verification of training



- 8. I am an internal employee why do I have to go through VOE and take a Periop Basics class?
 - VOE is the vetting process to ensure that all required documentation, confidentiality agreement, and safety quiz are completed
 - Again Anyone who observes, shadows, visits the Adult OR must attend a Periop Basics class
 - Our patients' safety is our priority and anyone who enters the OR should have a baseline knowledge of the surgical environment as well as expectations
