

Academic Gastrointestinal Surgical Pathologist

The Department of Pathology, Microbiology, and Immunology at Vanderbilt University Medical Center is expanding our GI Pathology service to add an additional service line. We are seeking a board certified anatomic surgical pathologist with subspecialty fellowship training in **Gastrointestinal, Pancreas, and Liver Pathology or General Surgical Pathology training with a focus on Gastrointestinal Pathology**. Candidates need to be eligible for medical licensure in the state of Tennessee. Depending on qualifications and experience, candidates could be eligible for appointment as an Assistant or Associate Professor on the Clinician Educator track. Full Clinical tract positions are also available. The Department focuses on its patients and its people and has a strong and diverse faculty with excellent training programs and a supportive atmosphere. These make it an excellent place to thrive as a surgical pathologist with subspecialty interests.
