THE TENNESSEE POISON CENTER SAVES LIVES

- The TPC is the **only** poison control center in the state of Tennessee.
- Poisonings continue to be a leading cause of injury death in Tennessee.
- The TPC managed 97,936 total calls in 2021 (including initial cases and follow-up calls).
- Poison control is **not** just for children! Poisonings can happen to anyone at any age.
- Sixty-one percent of human exposure calls in 2021 involved pharmaceuticals.
- The TPC has clinical and medical toxicologists with physicians on call 24/7.

THE TPC IS DEDICATED TO PREVENTING PEDIATRIC POISONINGS

- Forty-eight percent of poisonings reported to the TPC in 2021 involved children ages five years and under.
- Unintentional medication exposures remain a serious threat to young children.
- Safe storage of potentially toxic items and teaching children to "Ask First" will prevent a poison emergency.


THE TPC PARTNERS WITH THE STATE OF

- The TPC partners with the TN Department of Health and County health departments to monitor public health events and possible chemical and biological threats.
- In the event of a national or public health emergency, the TPC maintains the surge capacity to handle a large volume of calls.
- In conjunction with the TN Department of Health, the Tennessee Poison Center activated the Coronavirus Information Hotline on March 5, 2020. As of April 2022, we have managed more than 83,000+ calls to the Coronavirus Information Line.


S THE TPC PREVENTS UNNECESSARY ED VISITS AND SAVES TENNESSEE TAXPAYERS MONEY

• In 2021, the Tennessee Poison Center saved Tennessee taxpayers an estimated **\$30.3 million dollars** by preventing unnecessary emergency department visits for the underinsured with uncompensated care. Those essential dollars we saved Tennesseans in healthcare costs can be used toward food, shelter, transportation, clothing, education, and other necessities in their communities.


AGE IN YEARS OF POISONED PATIENTS




WHERE POISON EXPOSURES WERE MANAGED




REASON FOR EXPOSURE




CALL TYPE
