Clinical Director, Psychotic Disorders Program

We are seeking a psychiatrist to serve as Clinical Director of the Vanderbilt Psychotic Disorders Program (VPDP) in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Vanderbilt University Medical Center (VUMC). VPDP is an interdisciplinary team of clinicians and researchers who assess, treat, and study patients with a psychotic disorder. The clinical services include inpatient, partial hospital and outpatient programs, including coordinated specialty care of first-episode patients. The research program is translational, with a focus on neuroscience and longitudinal studies of first-episode patients. VPDP is a major training site for psychiatry residents and clinical psychology interns & postdoctoral fellows. The new clinical director will oversee all aspects of clinical services and will integrate high quality care with nationally recognized training and discovery-oriented research.

The position will be at the rank of Associate or Full Professor. The successful candidate will have a history of leadership excellence and clinical expertise in psychotic disorders. Board certification in General Psychiatry and licensure in the state of Tennessee are required. We are committed to building a culturally diverse faculty and strongly encourage applications from minorities and members of other underrepresented groups.
