

- and abide by the highest *ethical* and *professional* standards.








Diversity



The Whole Resident

A monthly seminar aimed at developing personal and professional skills to prevent and address burnout.

- Resident as Educator:
 - Learn practical teaching and supervisory skills
- Resident as Leader:
 - Learn conflict resolution and delivering feedback
- Resident as Self:
 - Develop skills of compassion, optimism, gratitude, and empathy
- Resident as Colleague
 - Participate in peer group mentorship

- 3 months of Internal Medicine (1 month can be Pediatrics)






