Alan Oestreich, MD

An internationally known pediatric radiologist, Alan Oestreich, MD, completed a residency in radiology at Strong Memorial Hospital, University of Rochester after graduating from Johns Hopkins School of Medicine. In pursuit of excellence in patient care and in teaching, Dr. Oestreich currently serves as Emeritus Professor of Radiology and Pediatrics, University of Cincinnati College of Medicine, where he has been on faculty as a pediatric radiologist since 1980. His special interests include pediatric orthopedic radiology, metabolic bone disease and mathematical applications of radiology.

A consummate scholar and advocate for medical learners, he is responsible for instructing and providing mentorship and career development opportunities for thousands of medical students, residents and fellows. Highly regarded in his field, he has been an invited guest lecturer near and far, including Meharry Medical College in Nashville, Tenn., Zurich Children's Hospital in Switzerland, Hadassah University Medical Center in Jerusalem, and University of Frankfurt. In tribute, the University of Cincinnati musculoskeletal reading room was renamed the Dr. Alan E. Oestreich Musculoskeletal reading room in 2009.

Dr. Oestreich has authored innumerable scientific manuscripts and books that have received national and international acclaim, including three editions of Pediatric Radiology-Medical Online Series. A member and leader in many national and international professional societies, he received numerous honors and awards, including Fellow of the American College of Radiology (1984), and the Singleton-Taybi Award of the Society of Pediatric Radiology for Lifetime Teaching/Education in Pediatric Radiology (2020).

In addition to an illustrious career in pediatric radiology, Dr. Oestreich has tirelessly advocated throughout his career for increasing underrepresented minorities in radiology, which led to membership in and serving as Chair of the Section on Radiology and Radiation Oncology for the National Medical Association. His writing and research acumen were leveraged to co-edit "A Centennial History of African Americans in Radiology" along with the section first published in 1996.
