Nursing Guidelines: Caring for Brachytherapy Patients

Prior to Radioactive Material Being Implanted:

- 1. Ensure that you have completed the *Caring for Radioactive Therapy*Patients training in Learning Exchange if you have not within the past 12 months.
- 2. Order disposable food service.
- 3. Complete any necessary room set up.
- 4. Obtain any required radiation monitors from OCRS.

Following Implantation of Radioactive Material:

- 1. Radiation Safety will post the room with "Caution: Radioactive Materials"
- 2. The patient is not to leave the room until radioactive sources have been removed or the patient has met the release criteria.
- 3. Always wear assigned radiation monitor before entering the patient room.
- 4. Do not clean the patient room
 - a. Linens and trash must remain within the room until removed or cleared by OCRS.
- 5. A lead shielded container and tweezers will be kept in the patient's room. In the unlikely event that you find a piece of radioactive material outside of the patient's body, use the tweezers to collect and store it in the shielded container.
 - a. Never touch the radioactive seeds or strands with your fingers.
 - b. Notify OCRS Radiation Safety and Radiation Oncology immediately.

Visitors:

- 1. Visitors are restricted to a dose limit of 100 mR/yr.
- 2. Pregnant Women and Minors (< 18 years) are not allowed
- 3. Specific Visitor Instructions are posted on the patient room door by OCRS.
