#### **Inclusive Higher Education**

There are now more than 300 inclusive higher education programs at colleges and universities across the country. About 40 percent of those programs are residential. These are generally certificate programs, and do not lead to a college degree.

# Paying for Inclusive Higher Education

- Tennessee STEPUP Scholarship, mirrors the Tennessee HOPE
   Scholarship, for students who graduated from a Tennessee high school
- Vocational Rehabilitation provides financial support for VR clients who are interested in college and employment
- Federal Financial Aid funds are available for students enrolled in eligible Comprehensive Transition Programs (CTP) and who have demonstrated financial need



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


#### **Transition Tennessee**

 Tennessee's online home for training and resources on preparing students (or adults) with disabilities for life after high school.



#### **Transition Tennessee**

#### **Vocational Rehabilitation?**

- VR provides a variety of individualized services to persons with disabilities in preparation for their employment in the competitive labor market.
- VR advocates for employment outcomes for clients that are consistent with their individual strengths, resources, abilities, capabilities and informed choice.
- Every state has a Vocational Rehabilitation program, although it may have another name.

### **VR Has Special Emphasis Services**

- Tennessee Rehabilitation Center at Smyrna offers a variety of vocational programs on campus with residential housing available.
- 17 Community Tennessee Rehabilitation Centers offer comprehensive vocational evaluation services, employee development services, job readiness training and placement.
- Services for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing
- Services for the Blind and Visually Impaired

- Cincinnati Children's Hospital began to train job seekers with disabilities to meet a need for qualified, reliable support staff in its Emergency Department.
- Program has been replicated in more than 300 sites worldwide.
- Tennessee's Division of Vocational Rehabilitation serves as a partner.
- Transition-to-Work Program is a business-led, 10-month unpaid employment preparation program that takes place at the workplace.





- Total workplace immersion combines classroom instruction, career exploration, and hands-on training through worksite rotations.
- Students complete a resume.
- Graduates get a Project SEARCH certificate of completion.
- Some programs are linked with school districts, some focus on those who are out of school.
- Stats from 2017-2018 showed 77.3% who completed the program were employed.

#### **Employment and Community First CHOICES**



- Gov. Bill Haslam designated Tennessee an Employment First state in 2013.
- Employment First means employment in integrated, competitive jobs is the first and preferred options for individuals with disabilities receiving state services.
- TennCare works with the three MCOs to provide services under the ECF CHOICES program, which

include many employment services.

#### **Employment and Community First CHOICES**

- Young people with intellectual or developmental disabilities who are exiting high school are a priority category.
- The three MCOs—BlueCare, Amerigroup and United Healthcare—contract with community provider agencies for employment services for their members.
- These provider agencies work with employers in hiring job seekers in ECF CHOICES.
- Agencies can provide ongoing job support for these individuals.

#### **DIDD 1915c Waivers**

- After the creation of Employment and Community First CHOICES and the state's designation as an Employment First State, DIDD revamped employment services for those in the 1915c waivers.
- Emphasis is now on asking all individuals in supports every year if they want to work.
- Medicaid waiver provider agencies provide long-term employment supports, if needed.

## **Individual Placement and Support**

- Tennessee Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services and VR offer, in partnership with community provider agencies, IPS Supported Employment model for persons with significant mental health concerns.
- Employment is seen as a vital part of the recovery process, not something that waits until recovery is accomplished.
- 52 counties have IPS providers.
