CHECKLIST FOR READING AND CRITICALLY EVALUATING THE LITERATURE

ABSTRACT
Did the abstract provide an adequate summary of the purpose and results of the
study?
INTRODUCTION
Was the purpose/justification clearly stated, logical, and convincing?
Was the literature review clearly discussed and connected to the present study?
METHODS
Is the study design clearly defined or clear in context?
Is the study sample(s) clearly defined, including how the sample(s) was (were)
chosen?
Are the data collection instruments/strategies adequately described, including an
evidence of their reliability and validity?
RESULTS
Are the characteristics of the study group(s) described?
Do the results relate to the purpose/justification of the study?
Are actual values reported (e.g., means, standard deviations or standard errors,
percentages), not just the results of statistical tests (e.g., P values)?
Were all the subjects who entered the study accounted for?
DISCUSSION
Are the study conclusions clearly supported by the data?
Do the authors extrapolate beyond the data?
Were the study setting and study subjects sufficiently representative so that the
results can be generalized to other subjects and to other settings?
Were there any major threats to the internal and external validity of the study that
could affect the reported conclusions?
