



Next, we have **Bradley lott, PhD**, of UCSF presenting during the DBMI Colloquium on March 2nd, 2023, at 12:00 pm CT:





As a reminder, the <u>Vanderbilt Clinical Informatics Center</u> launched <u>Vanderbilt Clinical Informatics</u> <u>Practical Shorts (VCLIPS)</u> last month. These are bite-size instructional videos on practical clinical informatics topics from expert VCLIC faculty. If you've ever wanted to learn more about how to engage with eStar (Epic), create new interventions or tools in our EHR, access data, perform human-centered design or evaluate interventions look no further.

You can watch these videos, and complete associated hands-on exercises anytime, but we will also continue to have in person sessions for each module where we'll repeat the content live, work through the hands-on exercises together and answer any questions you have. The modules we've released are:

Overview of VCLIC and Clinical Informatics at VUMC (Adam Wright, PhD)

- Learn about the history and background of EHR use at VUMC, how to engage with the EHR, and how VCLIC facilitates clinical informatics

 - Get an introduction to how providers interact with the EHR for patient chart review and patient visits
 - Learn how to build Best Practice Advisories (BPAs) for clinical decision support and other related components like groupers and preference lists

 - Get an overview of the data resources available, including VICTR's Synthetic Derivative,
 Research Derivative, and Record Counter and Epic's Hyperspace, Clarity, and Caboodle
 - Learn how to use Excel for data cleaning, descriptive statistics, and presentation-ready data plots
- Human-Centered Design Principles and Processes (Thomas Reese, PharmD, PhD; Megan Salwei, PhD; in person session on April 18th, 2023 from 1:00-2:30 pm)
 - Learn about how to use human-centered design principles and processes to make interactive systems and tools more usable
- <u>Evaluation and Dissemination of HealthIT Interventions</u> (Adam Wright, PhD; in person session on May 2nd, 2023 from 1:00-2:30 pm)
 - Learn why evaluation and dissemination are key parts of the clinical informatics life cycle and how to apply some common measurement frameworks and study design options

Each module has several short explanatory videos, many with demonstrations that you can follow along with, followed by an exercise meant to solidify learning. We will send out more details and signup information for each in-person session over the course of the semester. The workshop will run from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm in Light Hall 202. We will release a more detailed itinerary in the next few weeks, but broadly you can expect:


- 1. Explore FHIR as a key healthcare data standard and data model

Member Spotlight: Eddie Qian, MD, MS

Dr. Eddie Qian is a Clinical Fellow in Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine and will join faculty July 2023 as the Assistant Director for Quality and Education of the Medical ICU. He graduated from the University of Delaware, received his MD from New York University School of Medicine, and trained in Internal Medicine at Vanderbilt where he also completed his Pulmonary and Critical Fellowship and Master in

Applied Clinical Informatics. Dr. Qian's clinical interests are in intensive care medicine and post-intensive care recovery. His clinical research interests are in empiric antibiotic use in sepsis and his informatics research interests include EHR embedded clinical trials, interruptive alert de-escalation, and prospective validation of machine learning models.

When asked about his VCLIC Participation, Dr. Qian said:

"I'm very excited to continue working with VCLIC as I finish my clinical fellowship and join faculty! My primary project has been a randomized controlled trial in empiric antibiotic use (the ACORN trial) which leveraged the EHR for screening, enrollment, randomization, trial monitoring, and data acquisition for baseline characteristics and outcomes. Being a part of the VDAWGs program was CRITICAL in facilitating scheduled data monitoring reports during the trial and rapid iterations with our biostatics team during the analysis phase. In the future I'm interested in methods of prospectively evaluating interruptive alerts and prospective validation of the effect of machine learning models on clinical care and outcomes. I know many are others are already experts in these spaces and hope collaborate in the near future!"
