

Featured Member: Joey LeGrand, PharmD, MS



Joseph LeGrand, PharmD, MS, is a pharmacist and Lead Application Analyst in the Acute Clinicals portfolio of HealthIT at Vanderbilt University Medical Center. He received his PharmD from Butler University and his MS in Health Informatics from the University of Illinois at Chicago. He is currently heavily involved in clinical decision support analysis, build, maintenance, and reporting within eStar. In addition to his informatics work within eStar, he is interested in programming, data science, machine learning, dev ops, open health standards, standard medication terminology, health information exchange, APIs, digital health, and web application development.

In his own words:

"The major HealthIT projects I'm currently working on are preparing for a virtual nursing pilot on 7MCE to hopefully help with nursing workload, configuring functionality within Epic to allow providers to manually 'hold' medications, and managing Epic Hyperdrive upgrade preparations for the Acute Clinicals portfolio – as well as a variety of other smaller projects.


I've always been on the fringes of VCLIC due to my close work with our Clinical Decision Support (CDS) team and ongoing work to create and improve CDS tools within Epic. I have also collaborated on a VCLIC training video about Tableau data visualization basics, presented a poster about a novel way to generate synthetic patient medication data at the inaugural InformaticCon, and guest lectured a Vanderbilt MSACI class on the topic of building and evaluating CDS in Epic.

Right now, I'm interested in how we can more quickly and effectively leverage data coming out of our electronic health record (EHR) and other systems to reliably answer questions and make better decisions using modern data engineering best practices. One example of this is combining data from multiple systems to visually correlate changes in alert firing with changes to alert build and provider feedback submitted over time.

Outside of work, I founded and manage an organization called CodeRx which consists largely of pharmacists with skills or interests in programming and data. CodeRx has released several pieces of open-source software over the past few years including tools to generate synthetic patient medication data, parse free-text medication sigs into structured components, and extract-load-transform (ETL) open drug data into a data warehouse. I am always looking for people who would like to contribute to the community (you don't have to be a pharmacist!) and/or contribute to our open-source projects (all skill levels welcome!). VCLIC + HealthIT Evaluation and Dissemination Program

We are still piloting the VCLIC + HealthIT Evaluation and Dissemination Program, run by **Allison McCoy, PhD**, VCLIC Senior Project Manager **Laura Zahn, MS** and VCLIC Director **Adam Wright, PhD**.



Evaluation and dissemination are key parts of the clinical informatics life cycle, and critical to understanding the usability and effectiveness of a tool, identifying potential areas for improvement, and sharing the work with others so the benefits can spread. The VCLIC + HealthIT Evaluation and Dissemination Program aims to provide support to researchers and developers across these project stages. This includes projects that are already built and in progress that we can pair with informatics or other VCLIC members to complete the evaluation, either by providing data or help with analyses. We can also help with abstract and manuscript writing to facilitate publication and sharing at conferences.
