Member Spotlight: Parker Evans, MD



Parker Evans, MD, is a Franklin, TN native who completed his B.S. in Biochemistry and Molecular Biology at the University of Georgia and his Doctor of Medicine at Vanderbilt University School of Medicine. He is currently a General Surgery resident at Vanderbilt University Medical Center with plans to pursue fellowship in Pediatric Surgery. Parker is interested in biomedical and clinical informatics with the goals of furthering surgical research in children and improving the perioperative work environment. His wife Tita is an OB-GYN resident at Vanderbilt, and they have two dogs, Lou and June. He also enjoys woodworking, reading, hiking, climbing, and playing pool.

Currently, Parker is working on his Master's degree in Biomedical Informatics while completing his surgical residency. We are excited to feature him and to have him as a part of VCLIC! In his own words:

“My interests include harnessing clinical informatics and EHR-based data to improve surgical clinical workflows and surgical outcomes research. With the help of VCLIC, I am developing a dashboard for surgical residents to facilitate patient tracking and increase the efficiency of administrative tasks. We are in the usability testing phase of the project and hope to have it implemented by the end of the year. I am also working on integrating the Pediatric Appendicitis Score into an EHR-based pathway to support and study decision-making in the care of children with suspected appendicitis. The ultimate goals are to both reduce CT scans in pediatric patients while also avoiding unnecessary admissions.

I am always excited to hear about surgically-inclined informatics projects, and would love to connect with others with similar interests. Additionally, under the guidance of Dr. Gretchen Jackson and colleagues from other institutions, we are forming a Procedural and Surgical Informatics Discussion Forum (and eventually Working Group) through AMIA. Please let me know if you are interested in participating!”

 - During the project, Megan will apply human factors engineering approaches to develop a team-based technology to improve treatment decision making for newly diagnosed breast cancer patients. The COMPACT system will be designed and tested using human-centered design (HCD).
