


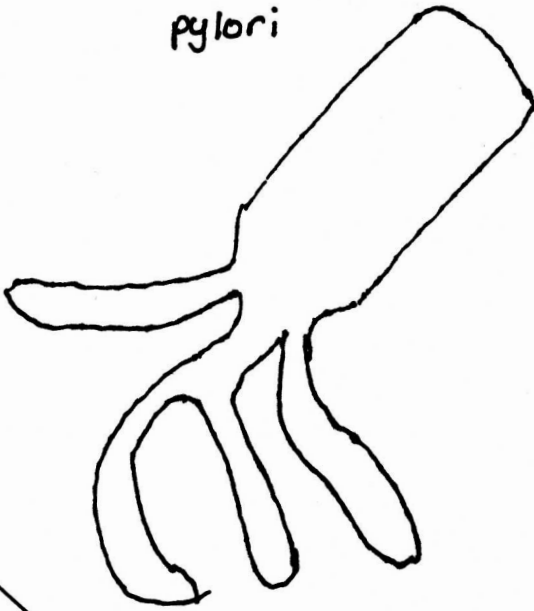

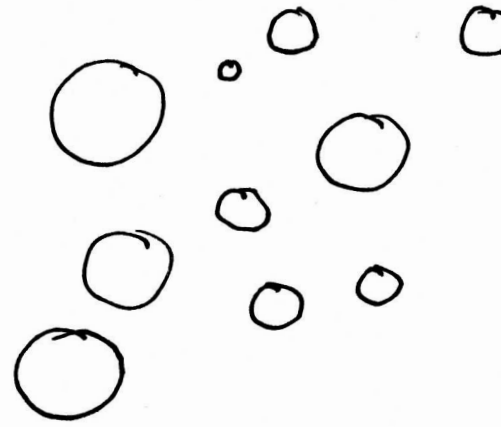

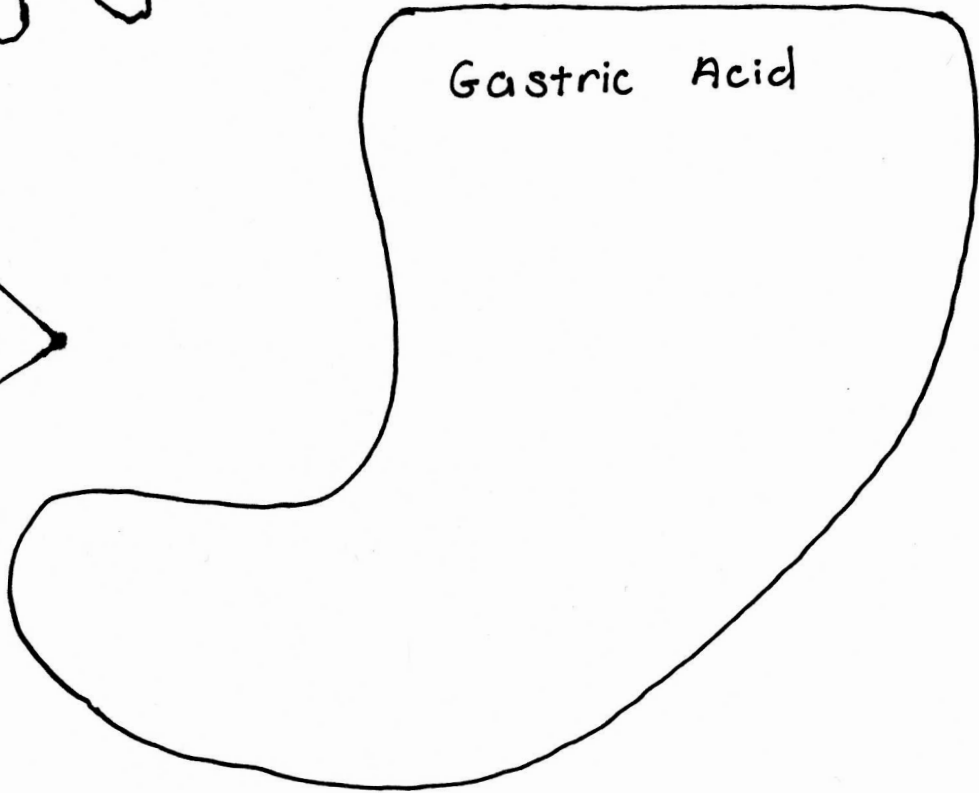

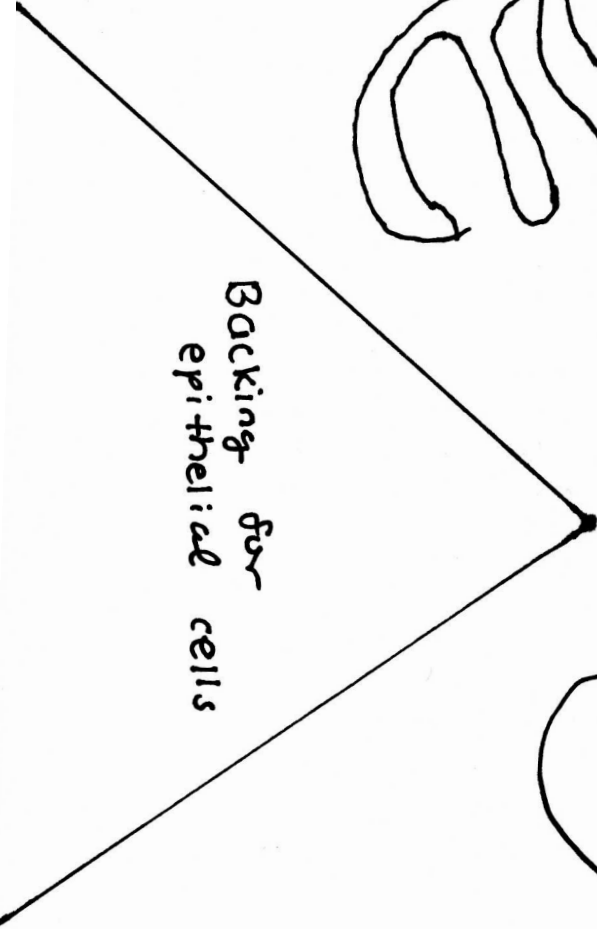
Gastric Bubbles
